GUATEMALA: JUSTICE ??? FOR VICTIMS OF THE RÍO NEGRO MASSACRES

PRONOUNCEMENT of ADIVIMA (adivima@yahoo.com) – Association for the Integral Development of Victims of Violence in the Verapaces, Maya Achí:

During the conflict, the village of Río Negro, in the Municipality of Rabinal, department of Baja Verapaz, suffered 5 massacres, which were carried out by the Army and Civil Defense Patrols from Xococ, under the governments of Lucas García and Efraín Ríos Montt.

The largest massacres were carried out on February 13, 1982, in which 73 (mainly) men lost their lives, and on March 13, 1982, in which 107 children and 70 women died and the village was destroyed, the remaining children orphaned and the surviving women widowed.

Subsequently, surviving children were forced into slavery; others took refuge in the mountains to save their lives, living in misery, persecution, inhuman conditions, exposed to the rain and the sun, suffering from hunger and thirst, and faced with the injustice of being expelled from their own land for the sole reason that they are poor and indigenous. These people were brutally massacred so that the Chixoy Hydroelectric Dam project (funded by the World Bank and Inter-American Development Bank) could begin

operations.

These events deserve justice and an explanation from the material and intellectual authors of these massacres, as well as from the state of Guatemala; and this can only happen if the silence is broken, impunity is no longer tolerated and demands are made that the laws of the country and the international treaties and conventions ratified by Guatemala be respected.

In this way, we will achieve justice, forgiveness, Reconciliation and peace.

After a ten-year struggle for justice, the Sentencing Tribunal of Baja Verapaz has declared 9AM, October 19, 2004, as the official time for the Public Trial on the issue of the third massacre in Río Negro, or the events which occurred on March 13, 1982.

We therefore call upon Human Rights Organizations, the National and International Press, brothers and sisters and victims of the internal conflict to accompany us, to ensure that there is transparency in the proceedings of the Public Trial, to obtain justice and sentencing of those who carried out the Río Negro massacre and to speak out against impunity.

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JUSTICIA POR LAS MASACRES DE RÍO NEGRO

La historia violenta de Guatemala, no concluye sin ninguna explicaciÛn de las masacres de nuestros familiares y de nuestras comunidades. Durante el conflicto armado interno, la aldea Río Negro del Municipio de Rabinal Baja Verapaz, sufriÛ 5 masacres, ejecutados por el EjÈrcito Nacional y Patrulleros de Autodefensa Civil de Xococ, del mismo municipio; bajo el gobierno de Lucas GarcÌa y EfraÌn RÌos Montt.

Las masacres de gran magnitud son las ejecutadas el 13 de febrero del aÙo de 1,982 donde perdieron la vida 73 hermanos y la masacre del 13 de marzo de 1,982 en donde se murieron 107 niÙos y 70 mujeres, en la cual dejaron

la
aldea destruida, con niÑos y niÑas huÈrfanos y viudas. A la que
posteriormente, los niÑos sobrevivientes fueron sometidos a la
esclavitud y
otros se refugiaron en montaÑas, salv·ndose la vida, en miseria, en
persecuciÛn, en condiciones infrahumanas, bajo la lluvia, sol,
aguantando
hambre y sed, ante la injusticia de ser despojado de sus propias
tierras,
por el hecho de ser pobres e indÌgenas, en la que brutalmente fueron
masacrados para iniciar sus operaciones el proyecto conocido como
HidroelÈctrica Chixoy (financiado por el Banco Mundial y el Banco
Inter-Americanano de Desarrollo).

Estos acontecimientos merece justicia y una explicaciÛn de parte de
los
autores materiales e intelectuales de las masacres, asÌ como el Estado
de
Guatemala; que sÛlo se obtendr· mediante el rompimiento del silencio y
la
intolerancia de la impunidad, exigiendo el cumplimiento de las leyes
del
paÌs y de los tratados y convenios internacionales ratificados por
Guatemala, para alcanzar la justicia, el perdÛn, la ReconciliaciÛn y
la paz.

Durante la lucha de mas de diez aÒos en busca de la justicia, El
Tribunal de
Sentencia de Baja Verapaz, ha seÙalado el dÌa 19 de Octubre de 2004, a
las
9:00 horas, para celebrar el Debate de Juicio Oral y P`blico, del caso
de la
tercera masacre de RÌo Negro, o sea el ocurrido el 13 de marzo de
1982, por
lo que CONVOCAMOS a: Organizaciones de Derechos Humanos, prensa
Nacional e
Internacional, hermanos y hermanas victimas del conflicto armado
interno,
para que nos acompañen para la observancia en la transparencia del
desarrollo del Debate Publico, para obtener la justicia y condena
contra los
responsables materiales de la masacre de RÌo Negro, y pronunciarse
contra la
impunidad.
